Year 7- Medieval Britain

This has been a wonderful half term for Maths at Bank View. The whole school took part in a fantastic NSPCC Number Day which saw pupils enjoy mathematics through their own creativeness and viewing mathematics in a new light. Our ambition is to grow our pupil's mindset in mathematics and show them how enjoyable maths can be and how it opens up career opportunities for them in the future.

We have a STEAM visit for Key Stage 3 coming in the next half term, again opening new opportunities for our pupils through mathematics.
