### Dear Parents/Carers

This half term has seen the opening of BankView@Croxteth a unit for primary pupils who require intensive short term intervention to improve their 'readiness to learn' and engagement in the classroom. The @model provides Bank View with the opportunity to share our expertise on SEN and ASD with mainstream colleagues. Here at Bank View, we have celebrated Safer Internet Day and as a school we continue to teach the pupils how they can keep themselves safe online, both in school and at home. Students have been busy preparing for the summer residential trip to Bibby's Farm learning about the importance of self reliance and personal resilience in Duke of Edinburgh lessons. They have been learning about suitable foods to take on the trip and visiting local parks to practice basic map

reading skills and walking over short distances which will increase over time in preparation for our expedition walk in May.

### Horticulture Groups

In November we finished weeding the allotment and covered the plots to keep the weeds down. We have spent the last couple of months writing up work towards the Entry level Qualification. When the weather has permitted

we have been putting rabbit fencing at the bottom of the playground to



prevent the rabbits damaging planting in school, this should be finished shortly after half term. When that is finished we will begin on the allotment sowing broad beans to start the new season.

On Wednesdays I plan to work with pupils on the school site. We need to put in some soakaways and plant a number of ornamental trees to give more interest on the playground. Now we have been in school for 18 months it has become clear where we need to add stepping stones to prevent damage to the planting.

I will also be approaching the Woodland Trust who will provide young native trees, so that we can

plant up the wild area damaged by the rabbits. There are the deep



beds and containers that need planting for colour as well, so a busy season beckons, if any pupils want to help with the gardening please let me know.


