What a lovely start we have had to our autumn term! Our students have settled back into Bank View life and we are fortunate enough to have many specialist organisations attend school each week and deliver some exciting opportunities to our students. We have now introduced 'Wellbeing Wednesday' activities on this day will be focused on all aspects of happiness and health that will include mindfulness, hand/head message and mindfulness breathing.

On October 10th it was World Mental Health Day. We all explored and celebrated the importance of mental health during form time across the school and made our very own awareness ribbons to display.



On Friday October 20th we hosted our first coffee morning of the new school year, for parents and carers. We had guests from ADDvanced Solutions on hand to listen and offer guidance when managing the neurodiverse needs of our young people.

Curriculum

Further to our parent curriculum meetings held this half term please find below more information on the curriculum, including how to navigate the website so you can see what your child is learning in school.

Our curriculum is designed and personalised to ensure pupils have the knowledge and cultural capital they need to succeed in life. The curriculum tab on the website can be used to find information about how we achieve this.

The tab is divided into key stages and then subjects. Each subject has produced a document showing its Intent.

Implementation and Impact.

Intent refers to what we want our pupils to learn. Implementation is the teaching activities we use to teach our curriculum. The impact is what our pupils have learnt from the curriculum.

Termly overviews have been sent out via Seesaw and are also available on the website (Key Information - Our Autumn curriculum 2023).

The parents evening is on November 16th from 3.30 - 6.30pm and subject reports will be produced for this. Appointments for parents of students who are at Speke will be from 4.15 - 6.30pm.

Parents Evening will be at the Fazakerley site for all pupils.

<u>Attendance</u>

Our whole school attendance for this half term was 89.3%.

This is below our target figure of 97% - which is what we regard as 'good attendance'.

We will be having our attendance draw after half term. We have 86 pupils who attendance is 100% and their names will be in draws for a voucher of £20.

We also have draws for 97% and above.

Any pupil with attendance below 90% is classed as a persistent absentee. This means every fortnight they miss a day of school which equals a lot of lost

learning. We continue to work closely with families around attendance, please contact your form team if there is any further support you wish to receive. We will be holding a coffee morning with attendance as the focus next half term.

OPAL UPDATE



Since starting our OPAL journey in September 2022, we have been working hard to create lots of new play opportunities for the children. Last week we completed our prefinal assessment check which saw a 28% increase in the quality of play since starting the OPAL project. I would personally like to thank all the OPAL play team for their hard work over the past 12 months. They have worked incredibly hard to create an environment where play is valued, and children have better play experiences. Our final assessment will take place in June- we are aiming for gold!

Over the summer we had a trampoline fixed at our Croxteth site, which has been a huge hit since returning in September.

As with the introduction of all new equipment, we always complete a

risk-benefit assessment. This allows us to look at the benefits of using equipment/completing activities against any potential risks.

This year we look forward to developing our Fazakerley site more. The OPAL working team have been busy planning lots of new exciting projects.

Food Options



refugees into their countries.




Congratulations Joshua Townsend

Reading Buddies



Humanities

Our sensory circuit has had a positive impact on the school as a whole and has helped children to develop independence. We look forward to continuing the hard work and developing the sensory provision further.





Spanish

We have had a great start to the year in our Spanish lessons, everyone is working hard, and we are having lots of fun as we learn through vocabulary games.

Year 7 have been learning about how to greet people and how to introduce themselves in Spanish, as well as the names for our classroom equipment. Some pupils have received a Spanish prize for their effort.



Year 8 are learning how to describe their houses and have designed their ideal house, there were some funny ideas as to where certain rooms should be, we even had a garage upstairs and a toilet in the garden!



Year 9 have been learning about clothes and colours. There was some very tricky grammar to understand but everyone made a great effort with it. They have designed their ideal outfits to go to different places.

Primary 2

the theme of "Marvellous Me". We have enjoyed our trips out - especially Forest School and our weekly trips to Rebound Therapy. We have been busy learning inside and outside of the classroom.





Primary 3

As part of their Flintstones topic, Primary 3 thoroughly enjoyed a visit from 'Ooga Booga', a Stone Age man who introduced the pupils to early human life. They have since created a Stone Age play tray using all the ideas learnt during the workshop. Learners have also been exploring rocks in science, linked to this topic. Pupils have also had a fantastic time learning about survival and safety in our Forest School sessions with Joe. Learners have created a den shelter, fire and explored different types of trees and leaves.

Primary 3 pupils are also enjoying practical curriculum lessons, including making body patterns in Maths and making a sandwich as part of the instructional writing unit for English.



Primary 4

Primary 4 have had a jam packed first half term. Our focus has been Space. We have written stories about astronauts and aliens in English. We've made our own planets using Play-Doh in Science. In Art, our artist focus was Peter Thorpe. We looked at his work and discussed what we liked and disliked about his style. We learnt some techniques to help us create space pictures in his style. In between all of this, we have been learning first aid and received certificates to acknowledge our achievements. We have worked really hard and are going to continue with our excellent work after half term!





Primary 5

This half term we have started our new topic 'Out of this World' the children have loved learning all about our solar system and the universe. In Art, the children have been looking at the artist Peter Thrope and creating some space themed artwork inspired by him. In English, we are beginning to write our very own space stories. The class have loved creating their own alien and superhero to be their story characters. We have been lucky enough this half term to have weekly Judo sessions which the children have engaged with and really enjoyed! We have also taken part in a First Aid training course that the children have completed to give them basic First Aid knowledge. Year 7

Year 7 have been looking at place value this half term, and during our numeracy lessons we've been applying our functional maths skills to 'Mathopoly'! Students have learned how to be patient with each other and take turns in a group activity.



On Monday 16th October 2023, both year 7 groups went pumpkin picking at The Pumpkin Patch, Hightown. They had a fantastic day and both form groups were able to take home their own pumpkins to carve. This was a lovely opportunity for both forms to work on their communication skills and develop their personal and cultural experiences.



7B celebrated the harvest festival by sharing their breakfasts together and coming together to make a classroom wreath out of all the materials they had collected.



During form time on Tuesday to Fridays, year 11 pupils have teamed up with pupils from year 7 to trial a new and exciting reading buddies system. They have been working hard to promote a love of reading to our year 7s by reading in pairs during Let's Read in the mornings.





The school will not authorise any absences unless they received the following:


- 1. A copy of a prescription.
