The options group have been learning about their school and favourite subjects and learning how to express justified opinions. They are all working really hard towards their award.





History

<u>Year 7- Medieval Britain</u>

Year 7 have been learning about Medieval Britain and in particular the Battle of Hastings and William the Conqueror. They have been interested to explore the legacy of William the conqueror and how this is seen in today's society.

<u>Year 8- Biomes</u>

Year 8 have been investigating the hot deserts. They have located hot deserts around the world and researched why they are found where they are. We have explored various plant and animal adaptations found in the hot desert and we will be looking at ways in which humans are having to utilize the hot deserts. Year 9- WWII

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Year 9 have started their topic on WWII and the rise of the Nazis. They have researched Hitler's journey to power and assessed what life was like under Nazi dictatorship. This half term we have look specifically at the impact WWII had on Britian by investigating the Blitz. Year 9 were able to see firsthand the impact WWII had on Liverpool and they investigated the importance of Liverpool during this time. All year 9 pupils had the opportunity to visit a real WWII bunker here in Liverpool.

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Humanities Options Group

We have been learning about tourism and the impact this has on local communities both positive and negative. Pupils are really enjoying this topic! We will be experiencing some tourism activities in Liverpool next term.

<u>Computing</u>

This term we took our year 9 cohort along on a CyberFirst trip to HOST at Media City. Pupils enjoyed a tour of ESports and the immersive lab, they engaged in the AI debate, learnt how to use cryptography and enjoyed a gaming experience in the gaming lab. As well as learning about the wonderful world of technology, pupils were given information on a range of career paths. The team were very complimentary of our pupils, their engagement and the fantastic ideas they shared



PHSE

In Year 9 we have been learning all about a healthy lifestyle. We have looked at physical and mental health and discussed why they are different but also how they can both help our mental wellbeing. As an example, for this we went for a walk around Walton Park and spoke about how important it is to speak as a problem shared is a problem halved. We have also been learning about our work life balance and how we should limit our screen time. We have also looked at body image and discussed how it is mainly in our own heads how we feel about our body.



World <u>Views News</u>

Once again students in World Views have completed some fantastic work over the last term. Well done! Primary 1

Primary 3

Pupils have also created animal shaped shadow puppets in science.



Children have also continued develop practical outdoor skills in

Forest School. They have been working hard to earn badges when skills have been demonstrated and practiced, including shelter and fire building.



Pupils have also participated in a number of Celebration events, including World Book Day and Science Week. The children had a fabulous World Book Day, dressing as characters and taking part in a book related scavenger hunt and quiz, as well as creating a class book. The children had a great day celebrating World Book Day and showing off their fabulous costumes to their friends. Base 1b had a lovely day at Knowsley safari park recently. They loved taking pictures of the meerkats and watching the sea lion show.

We also went on a Geography trip to visit local areas on an Ordnance Survey map - such as the train station and fire station. Netherton fire station were kind enough to invite us into the station to try on their equipment and sit in the fire engine.



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Base 1

Base 1 have been taking part in yoga sessions this term with Elly from Yogabears. They have really enjoyed learning a range of different yoga poses and relaxing during guided meditations. Well done Base 1 you are all yoga superstars.



We have really enjoyed reading an abridged version of 'Wind in the Willows' this term. We have explored adjectives and similes and pupils have written some fantastic

character and setting descriptions! Pupils have also worked on sequencing events, and they have even planned and wrote a short next chapter of the book! We are all very sad to have finished this book, but I have thoroughly enjoyed reading everybody's new chapter! I am very impressed with pupil's ideas and writing. Well done Base 1!

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We enjoyed our topic on money. We were able to recognise, order and add money and pupils worked well in groups to make given amounts using the coins. We have also been working on multiplication and division this term and pupils have learnt lots of new methods. Base 1 have been learning about living things. It has been so much fun learning about animal habitats, which animals migrate or hibernate for winter and which animals are predators and preys. Pupils also enjoyed exploring classification charts for minibeasts! We have really enjoyed our theme this term learning about transport, animals, nature and maps. Pupils have loved exploring British countryside and were able to take pictures and also create artwork around this. Pupils have explored shapes and colours in British countryside and we have enjoyed exploring it through our senses in the environment and through videos, e.g. nature sounds, textures and smells.

Pupils also really enjoyed visiting points of interest on an OS map during our day trip out. We visited a church, a school, a fire station, a hospital, a bus station and a train station. Whilst at the train station, we took some pictures of the train and we spoke to an employee about their job role, linking to our PSHE topic about careers.

Pupils have made cars in DT which look fantastic and they have followed some step by step guides in Art to draw both old and new trains. We definitely have some budding artists in our class! Base 1 filled their reward jar this half term and we had a fantastic day out at the safari park! Our favourite animals were the monkeys, giraffes and lions! We look forward to starting out new topic 'Port of Liverpool' after Easter!



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Base 3

Students have studied Romeo and Juliet in English this term. They have written some fantastic diary entries, informal letters, character profiles, a play review, and have worked to develop their speaking and listening skills. Each morning, 20 minutes is dedicated to listening to a text being read aloud. The class choose the novels we read by participating in a class vote. We are currently reading a novel called Wonder by R. J. Palacio. Our next class novel will be Deadly Deep by Jenifer Killick, which is the fourth novel in the Dread Wood series. Talking to your child at home about what they are reading in school is a great way to improve reading for pleasure and foster a love of reading. We have

This term students have revisited multiplication and division. They are becoming more confident in accessing a variety of methods to support working out answers. Curriculum trips continue to help support students accessing their wider community. Students have visited a variety of different shops and have been supported to select monies, pay for items, and wait for change.

Base 3 have studied the science topic elements, mixtures and

compounds throughout the Spring term. They have participated in numerous experiments and have learned about the process of separating mixtures through filtration, distillation, chromatography and evaporation. In ICT we are learning to develop and present information using ICT. Students have created presentations based upon their interests and hobbies, compiled a list of recommended clubs for Bank View to present to their peers, corrected mistakes using ICT, and screenshot information.



<u>KS5 Internal Work</u> <u>Experience</u>

A number of our sixth form students participate in work experience. Below is Lennon working in the Long Lane Kitchen with Jo. We also have Michael showing his confidence, attention to detail and maturity when working with year 7's in the Art department. Sixth form students now attend Bank View Speke site every Tuesday to complete their Personal and Social development. This term students are focusing on personal safety in the home and community. Students love the space and find it fantastic being able to utilise the sports hall to complete UK Military school activities.

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chemist of any medication that has been bought over the counter for the pupil.


