Inspiring Curriculum

The curriculum at Bank View School is designed to be broad, balanced, challenging and engaging thus inspiring students to learn. As a school, we are committed to improving the life chances for all our students. We have high expectations for our students, and we want them to enjoy and engage in their learning. We challenge our students, but more than that, we want them to have the resilience to challenge themselves. At Bank View students have a personalised pathway through school. All students enjoy equality of opportunity, regardless of sex, race or ability. We aim to provide an education which is relevant and worthwhile, preparing our students for the world of work and ensuring that they leave us as caring young adults who have developed positive attitude, values and are respectful of others. We offer a range of subjects which reflects the demands of the National Curriculum and place a great emphasis on the transference of skills across the school. The curriculum prepares students for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences which they will encounter after leaving us whilst promoting spiritual, moral, social and cultural level.

Wellbeing Hub

The Wellbeing Hub is a safe, welcoming and friendly space. We are here to help you settle in and to talk if you have any worries. We have supportive mentors that are regularly available to share your worries, your funny stories and a nice biscuit or cup of tea! We will also be working with you to help you build new friendships and make the most of your time at Bank View School.

Positive Behaviour

Research has shown that our thoughts, emotions and behaviours are interconnected and influence one another. Therefore, you can change, or at least influence, one by changing another. Restorative practice builds up skills such as resilience, tolerance and empathy as well as developing social and communications skills.

At Bank View School, we have been working with Restorative Practice Limited. We have embedded a restorative ethos in our school community. We use restorative questioning to communicate with staff, pupils and the wider school community. Pupils take part in activities which helps to develop speaking and listening skills. We support pupils in developing their awareness of emotions and how they may affect behaviour and choices. We use the Zones of Regulation at Bank View School to support students' self-regulation.

The School Day

The school day starts at 8.45 am and finishes at 3.15 pm.

We have breaks in the morning, afternoon and lunchtime, along with regular movement and sensory breaks throughout the day. Students take part in 5 lessons a day.

Class timetables may change throughout the year so that children can attend swimming and a variety of enrichment activities.

The structure of the school day is currently under consultation.

If accepted the school day will finish at 2:40pm. With buses leaving between 2: 40pm and 3:00pm.

Please leave any correspondence at the school office in a sealed envelope marked for the attention of the chair of governors. This will be dealt with confidentially.

Attendance

The Government have set a minimum expected attendance of 97%. This would mean a child has no more than 5 ½ days' absence over the course of a school year. Anything below this may be a cause for concern. If your child is not attending school for medical reasons allowances will be made.

If your child is not able to attend school, please telephone the school office no later than 9.30 am to inform us of the reason for their absence each day.

If your child is late arriving at school, please bring them to the front office so they can be registered for the day. Lateness is recorded and can have an impact on your child's learning.

Medical/ Illness

Illness

If your child is ill during the school day, then they will need to be collected as soon as possible. Please make sure the office has all the telephone numbers necessary to contact you at work or at home.

Medical appointments

It is helpful to know in advance about any medical appointments and a copy of the appointment letter sent to school via seesaw.

Asthma

For children with asthma, please provide the school with a clearly labelled inhaler stating your child's name and dosage. If a spacer is required, it is the parents' responsibility to provide this.

Medication

Designated staff will administer medication to children only when it has been prescribed by a medical proffessional. Medication should have a prescription label with the child's name and the dosage clearly visible. You will be required to complete a consent form at the office when handing over the medication.

Children with serious medical conditions will need a healthcare plan, this will be completed by staff, parents and with the help of outside agencies if needed.

Head lice

Please regularly check your child's hair for head lice. Long hair should always be tied up for school to reduce the spread of head lice.
