


Zara, Ollie and Tom are coming to Bank View

Most children will come to school by mini-bus, like Zara.


Kind adults will look after from the time you are collected from home until you get to school.

Some children will be brought to school by their grown-ups.


When you get to school, an adult will be waiting to meet you and take you to your classroom.

We want everyone to feel happy at school, so children use the ‘Zone of Regulation’ board and put their name sticker on the board which best matches how they are feeling.


Zara is feeling a bit sad today so her teacher will have a chat with her to see what is wrong.

You will have lots of fun learning, playing and making friends in the classroom and outdoors.


You will learn English, maths, art, music, history, geography, science, PE and lots more.
